2018.01.1 Letter of request for membership from Stephania Manzo was read to MfWfB. M&C will bring this forward for seasoning at our next MfWfB.

2018.01.2 Review of Agenda and Minutes. Minutes were approved as edited.

2018.01.3 Ministry and Council Report. (Attached)

2018.01.3.1 Susan R. requested volunteers to work on the State of the Meeting report. A Friend suggested that we begin by drawing a chart rather than using words. Another Friend shared that at a recent palliative care conference a graphic recorder was used. Some found it very helpful, others did not. More discussion ensued about what Aurora envisioned as a process. Several people joined in brainstorming how it might work.

The Clerk suggested that M&C include Aurora F. in the planning for the second hour on Jan 28 where the State of Society report process will begin.

A request was made for volunteers to take notes and consolidate the information.

Aurora volunteered to produce a consolidated drawing.

A request for a recorder and an editor for the process will go into the ENews.

2018.01.3.2 Follow-up on Meetinghouse second hours. M&C suggested formation of an ad-hoc committee with the following process: Meetinghouse Committee makes recommendations (with others) to Nominating Committee to include people with complementary expertise, resources, passion and wisdom.

In response to a concern from a member of Nominating, Susan R. pointed out that this could occur after Nominating finishes the bulk of it's current role.

Virginia H suggested that this should be a standing committee rather than an ad hoc committee since the task is likely to go on for over a year.

Joanne C also felt it should be a permanent committee and that Nominating should be involved in the process.

John H reported that M&C wanted this to be an ad hoc committee specifically so that it would not go on forever.

Other Friends voiced pro and con feelings. A Friend suggested that it begin as an ad hoc committee and then be changed to a regular committee if needed.

Two Friends suggested that if it is an ad hoc committee should have a time-limited task. A Friend expressed a preference for use of an ad hoc committee so that involvement in and identification with purchase of a meeting house should be shared widely among Friends.

The Meeting agreed to send this back to M&C for further discussion and definition of the nature the committee to be formed and the responsibilities of that committee.

2018.01.3.3 Comments were requested regarding projection of the query during MFB. A Friend shared that she found the noise of the fan on the projector really distracting.

Others were entirely unaware of it. Friends agreed that it could be projected during and for a few minutes after reading the query.

2018.01.3.4 Comments were requested regarding having presentations during potluck. A Friend shared that it seemed to work well if we do it after people have finished eating. Another Friend expressed concern that people might be leaving rather than staying for the presentation.

2018.01.4 Finance Committee (Reports Attached). 2018.01.4.1

It was noted that total contributions were well over the budgeted amount by the end of the year.

Discussion ensued about the \$30,000 in unrealized gains that the Meeting made on investments. Some is for the Meeting house fund and some is not. A Friend noted that funds in our FGC sponsorship and Activity Fund are declining in spite of the unrealized gains in investments. It was clarified that this is in accord with a Meeting decision to allow gains on these investments to be shifted to general funds. A Friend shared that it was good to hear other Friends asking more detailed questions and taking more ownership of Financial decisions.

2018.01.4.2

The Clerk shared that Lucretia Humphries (from Annual Session) shared that they will be asking that Friends pay what they can rather than apply for scholarships. Annual Session is therefore asking Meetings to make contributions to Annual Session to help cover the anticipated increased cost. A Friend suggested that we not make a contribution immediately, but wait and see how the new system affects the overall balance sheet for Annual Session. Another Friend gave a bit of historical perspective saying that Quarterly Meeting has had a pay as you can system for several years and it has been supported by \$5000 from a bequest by Annelise. They have steadily withdrawn funds to cover expenses and the fund will not last much longer.

A Friend asked whether our meeting will contribute at all. A Friend asked whether a Friend in our Meeting who would like to go to Annual Session and could not afford to pay the full amount - whether they could request money from our Activity Fund to augment their contributions. Another Friend said she would like for us to underwrite our own members who wish to go to Annual Session rather than expect other Meetings to underwrite our member's attendance. Another Friend suggested that Finance Committee go back over several years to see how much we have given in financial aid for Annual Session over the past several years. The Clerk suggested that we make a donation of between \$350 and \$500 to Annual Session. A Friend suggested that we get an accurate assessment from the Treasurer. A Question was raised regarding whether this would be an annual donation.

The Meeting requested that the Treasurer go back over the last several years to tally funds used for scholarships for Annual Session and come back with a recommendation for an annual donation.

2018.01.8 Member Concerns

2018.01.8.1 - **Microphones** - A Friend asked that the signs be reworded to indicate invitation rather than requirement to use the microphones. Dave H. volunteered to draft new signs.

2018.01.8.2 - Retreat? A Friend asked whether any thought had yet been given to the yearly retreat.

A Friend asked whether people preferred a Spring retreat of a Fall retreat.

One Friend expressed a preference for a Fall retreat. Most Friend in the room were interested in having a retreat. A one day retreat seemed to be the preference of those in the room.

A Friend recalled that we previously decided that the campout will now be held every other year rather than every year.

Another Friend suggested that a Retreat might be better held in the Spring when the weather is nice.

- **2018.01.8.3** Don G. asked the we make official the position of "Family Promise Coordinator". The Meeting agreed to have this listed in the directory as a specific job
- **2018.01.8.4 Don G.** asked if we want the Children's facilitator team should be listed in the directory. Virginia H. did not object. However the Meeting agreed that it was not necessary since it is in the News every week.
- **2018.01.8.5** Don G. reported that Children's attendance actually increased this past year.
- 2018.01.8.6 Meeting approved use of the Quaker Banner in the Women's March this Saturday if sufficient people are willing to help carry it.

An announcement will be placed in the ENews, and Virginia H will take the sign home.

2018.01.8.7 A Friend shared that Friends are not coming to Singing Sunday. It was suggested that Friends gather around the piano.

The ENews will announce it more regularly and will encourage those who do not wish to sing to find another place for discussions. Dave will make a gracious sign for the door.

2018.01.8.8 A Friend brought up a concern about Flu season. Several suggestions were offered to reduce risk of transmission including

- bringing and using hand sanitizer,
- reducing handshaking in favor of bowing
- thanking Friends who stay home when they feel they are coming down with a cold or illness.

CARE OF MEETING GUIDELINES

Thank you for being in care of Meeting for worship today. While we all share responsibility for coming to worship prepared and holding our Meeting in the Light, today you have taken the spiritual responsibility of being particularly attentive. We ask that you arrive about 10 minutes early to settle in by example, and also ask that you close worship and facilitate sharing at the rise of worship. Feel free to use your own words, but below are some examples. Words in [brackets] indicate options to be used at your discretion.

Joys and Sorrows. About 11:00 (when you sense the worship coming to a close), please rise and offer some form of the following invitation: "Welcome, Friends. Continuing in the spirit of worship, we would like to take a few minutes now to invite you to share any joys and sorrows you may have, or to ask Friends to hold you or someone else in the Light. We will introduce ourselves and share announcements afterward."

Introductions. You may be seated for joys and sorrows, or remain standing if you like. When you feel there has been enough time, start a handshake around the room. We like to try to include children in the last few minutes of worship. If children have not yet arrived, open the door for them (or ask another Friend to do so), so they know rise of meeting has occurred. Then you may stand and say something like,

"Thank you, Friends. It is our custom to go around the room and introduce ourselves, [and if there's time] and share any afterthoughts that did not rise to the level of vocal ministry." [We try to keep introductions brief on Business Meeting Sundays particularly.]

"Members of the Ministry and Counsel Committee are here to receive any questions, concerns or ideas that you might have about our Meeting. Their nametags are identified with a green dot."

"If you are new to Meeting or returning after a long absence, please share a little about how you came to be here this morning."

"If you would like, we invite you to share with us the gender pronouns you prefer. My name is _____ [and I prefer [she, her, hers][he, him, his][they, them, their][male pronouns][female pronouns][gender neutral pronouns][any pronouns you choose for me because I am so totally grounded and yet so totally fluid with my gender]] and I am in care of meeting today.

After everyone has been introduced, continue:

Guests. "Welcome guests; please sign our guest book on the table and fill out a Welcome Card if you would like to receive our weekly electronic

newsletter or other information, or to request a permanent name tag."

Donations. "We have a donation box on the table."

Sign-ups. Check to see if there are enough people signed up for cleanup after meeting. If not, announce the need. For example, "I notice that no one is signed up for cleanup helper today. Please help if you can. It is very much appreciated!" and then, "Our Meeting is run entirely by volunteers. Please take a look at the sign-up sheet being passed around and sign-up to help with the meeting if you are able."

Children. (If children are present) "What did the children do today?" Children's departure: "The children may leave for snack."

Announcements. "Please be brief. Use the calendar to record the date and time of upcoming events."

Second hour. (If not already announced) "What is today's second hour?"

Snack. "Thank you to those who brought snacks. Please remember to clean your own dishes. We always need volunteers to stay and help with cleanup."

Meetinghouse Committee Report

Report to Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business

January 14, 2018

The report of the Meetinghouse Committee for December 10, 2017 mentioned as a conclusion of the Joint Meeting of the Finance Committee and the Meetinghouse Committee that: *purchase of a property for a meetinghouse will require borrowing money.*

Inadvertently left out of that report:

The Meetinghouse committee will make a recommendation to Meeting for Worship for Business that we seek unity around obtaining a loan as a way to purchase a Meetinghouse if a suitable property is found by the scouts. We are seeking <u>approval in concept</u>, rather than actually seeking pre-approval of loans, etc.

The Clerk of the Meetinghouse Committee finds it difficult to reconcile the role of Meetinghouse Liaison with the role of Clerk. Moving the Meeting to the auditorium ("The Rookery") downstairs has made the Liaison task more complicated. Virginia Herrick will assume the responsibilities of Clerk of the Meetinghouse Committee. Dave Hopkinson will remain on the Committee, not in the role of Clerk.

A manual for setting up the audio equipment prior to Meeting has been created. One purpose of the manual is to help train Friends in the steps required to make the audio equipment ready for meeting, so that John Hatten and Dave Hopkinson are not the only persons able to do so. Don Goldstein has expressed interest in learning how to set up the audio equipment.

Allen Stockbridge has returned to Baltimore where he will remain for at least several months. Mimi Freshley and Virginia Herrick have fulfilled their terms as members of the Meetinghouse Committee, but both are inclined to remain on the Committee.

The next meeting of the Meetinghouse Committee is on Jan 30th at the Hopkinson home.
